Other expenses includes textbooks, technology licenses and software, year level camps and retreats, compulsory in-class excursions, yearbook, student diary, alumnae membership, P&F levy, and school photos.

The tuition and non-tuition fees do not include stationery, laptop (except Year 5), specialised equipment/materials, optional co-curricular sports and activities, co-curricular camps and tours, international and domestic exchange programs or school tours, all of which are parent's responsibility and therefore paid for separately.

Please note: It is school policy that all fee accounts must be in order to allow students to participate in optional activities. The school reserves the right to redirect funds paid for optional activities towards unpaid fees. Year level camps are a part of the school curriculum and if a student does not attend for whatever reason, there is no reduction in the Tuition Fee.

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)	Up to \$900	<p>All international students must be covered by Overseas Health Cover. Parents can choose to purchase Health Cover independently or select for the school to purchase this on their behalf. This can be selected during the enrolment process.</p> <p>Should parents choose to purchase Overseas Health Cover via the school, the amount quoted by the Health Cover Provider is charged for each student prior to enrolment and is payable in full for the duration of the schooling.</p> <p>The school will refund the pre-paid amount that is refunded by the provider if an enrolment cancellation is made prior to the commencement of the student's course. If the student leaves the school prior to the completion of the course, the parent(s) / guardian(s) must seek a refund from the provider directly.</p>

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HOMESTAY ACCOMMODATION FEES

Stuartholme School homestay placements are provided by International Student Care Australia (ISCA). Please note that all Homestay Fees will be invoiced separately by ISCA. All Homestay Fees are payable directly to ISCA one study period in advance. Stuartholme School will require confirmation from ISCA of the Homestay payment to continue the enrolment process. Non-payment of Homestay fees may result in the student's exclusion from classes.
