History of Stuartholme

Stuartholme School is an international School of the Sacred Heart. The Society of the Sacred Heart is an international congregation of Catholic religious women, established by Saint Madeleine Sophie Barat in France in 1800. One of 200 schools in 40 countries, Stuartholme was established in 1920 with just five young girls in March and another two in August.

During World War II, Stuartholme became the 42nd General Hospital of the United States Army. Unfortunately, it was not possible for students to stay at the current location, so the school was packed up and moved firstly to Canungra and then to Southport. For much of its history, Stuartholme operated as a boarding school only. Day students were only accepted from February 1952. Although the school now caters for both day and boarding students, it remains Brisbane's only Catholic girls' boarding school.

In the early 1970s changes to the educational system and funding led to the Archbishop of Brisbane bringing the parish schools under the care of the newly established Catholic Education Office. At this time, he asked the Religious Institute schools to give up their Primary Schools in order to strengthen the Catholic system. In a time of constant change, many schools, including Stuartholme, are now reopening some primary classes in their schools.

As our school population has grown over the years, the facilities have also developed. The library was built in 1986 and replaced the wartime structure left by the United States Army. The Spruson building was added in 1992 and work began in 2002 on the multi-purpose Joigny performing arts centre which replaced the old nurses' quarters erected in 1942. Sporting facilities have been developed over time, with the most notable additions being the five tennis courts, oval and aquatic precinct.

QUICK TIPS FOR GETTING YOU STARTED

Absence

Please notify by phone or email if your child will be away for the day via the Stuartholme app or absentee line 07 3510 6488.

Late Arrivals

If a student arrives after 8.30am, they are required to report to the Junior Office where they will sign in.

Early Departures

Because of the age of our Junior School students, parents are asked to collect their child from the Junior School office. No Junior School student will be allowed to leave the school grounds without a parent or guardian being present.

Sickness

If a student is unwell, please do not send them to school. If a student presents unwell at school or receives an injury, they will be initially treated by the Junior School Reception before a decision is made as to whether to contact parents to collect. The Health Centre may also be consulted.

Mobile Phones

When a student arrives at school, they should switch their phone to silent or off and drop off into the named pockets in the Junior School Office.

Stationery

As part of the school fees, the Junior School supplies all stationery requirements to students. Stationery will be distributed on the first day of school.

Communication

With the large amount of information that comes from a school catering for Years 5-12, it is important to know where to go for the information you need.

Stuartholme App

The app is a valuable source of information. There is an avenue to inform the school of your daughter's absence, receive daily news from the school, the school calendar and information on co-curricular training and competitions.

My Stuartholme

My Stuartholme is the school portal and gives access to a wealth of information to parents, including your daughter's timetable, assessments, the school calendar and teachers' names. The portal also has a year level tile which is updated each week with upcoming events and photos.

School Newsletter

The school newsletter is distributed on a fortnightly basis. It can be accessed through the school app.

Social Media

Stuartholme has a number of social media accounts including Facebook and Instagram. These accounts share events, news and stories to the wider community.

Contacting my Daughter

Parents are asked to email the classroom teacher or Junior Reception to pass on any messages.

Year 5 and 6 parents are asked to refrain from directly contacting their daughters during the day. For more urgent messages, it is recommended parents ring the Junior School Reception.



Year 5 and 6 Laptop Program

For Year 5 and 6, the school provides a well-managed and resourced laptop program. Year 7 - 12 use a BYOD model.

In Week 3 of Year 5, students will be provided with a school owned and supplied laptop for use in Years 5 and 6. There are clear expectations around the use of the laptops with an emphasis on using the laptop to assist student learning. Students are discouraged from downloading apps and programs for personal use such as games.

Term 1 focuses on familiarisation with the school computer and a technology induction. Students navigate the use of myStuartholme and uploading assessments to the portal. Specialist Digital Technologies lessons focus on extending the students' skills in the use of technology.

To support the responsible use of technology, the school works with the students during wellness lessons to create awareness of cyber-safety, digital footprint and the legal responsibilities of technology.

Cafe Access

The cafe is open from 7.00am each morning. Year 5 and 6 students can access the cafe during these times. Stuartholme runs a cashless cafe so students will need to use their ID card which is linked to their flexischools account. The ID card can also be used to purchase uniform items from the school shop.

Lunches and morning teas for Year 5 and 6 students need to be preordered using a flexischools account. Preordered morning teas, lunches and drinks will be delivered to the classrooms using industry standard insulated food service trolleys. Our kitchen is staffed by five qualified chefs and meets the Smart Food Guidelines for schools. The menu is approved by a qualified dietician.
